

Technical Assistance Activities for the Addiction Care Program What to Expect in 2017-18!

Maine Quality Counts (QC) will be providing technical assistance and support to all of the grantees in the Addiction Care Program. This will include:

- Facilitation and educational content for two grantee meetings (with a potential third meeting occurring in 2018)
- Grantee self-assessment tool to help identify technical assistance needs as well as assets and resources that can be shared amongst the other grantees
- Tailored technical assistance plans for each grantee
- Provision of tailored educational approaches, peer coaching and support to each grantee, based on their identified needs and complementary to what exists within grantee organizations/networks
- Access to an updated, online MAT toolkit that includes standardized tools, templates, and educational resources, along with support for leveraging and sharing new and existing tools
- Regular opioid policy updates and identification of policy-related barriers and challenges

Technical Assistance

QC will develop a Technical Assistance (TA) Plan for this project, to include individualized content for each grantee based on their unique project needs.

The initial Technical Assistance Plan will be discussed on September 13 and refined by end of Sept.

Individual Support and Peer Coaching

The tailored technical assistance approaches will be incorporated into the TA Plan in September, once the results of the self-assessment tool are received and analyzed and feedback from the evaluation team can be incorporated.

Ad hoc requests for support and technical questions can be directed to QC for coordination.

MAT Toolkit

The initial toolkit will be presented at the first grantee meeting. An online version of the toolkit is available on the MEHAF website under Addiction Care Grantee meeting #1.

The toolkit will be updated throughout the project to include new tools, and leverage existing tools from each of the grantees.

Regular policy updates will be provided by the Maine Medical Association.
